Semester 1 2025 Academic Awards

Subject Selection

Subject selection for Year 11 2026 (current Year 10 students) commenced on Monday this week and closes on Thursday (tomorrow). Students have received a link via email to choose subjects in the initial round. This allows the school to formulate a timetable with subjects with sufficient interest. Subject selection for Year 8-10 2026 (current Year 7-9 students) opens on Friday 15 August. More information, including a recording explaining the process, will be available to students and parents soon.

Year 12 Mock Exams

Year 12 students will undertake a mock exam block to prepare for the QCAA External Exams (General subjects), scheduled for Term 4. These mock exams practice the knowledge and skills students will need to know to succeed in 'the real thing'. Students have been emailed

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the mock exam timetable and will be working closely with their teachers to revise and prepare well. The mock exam data will be used by teachers to develop targeted revision activities to complete in Term 4, before students finish to start their external examinations. For students on an Applied pathway, these classes will run as normal, and school attendance is expected.
